2023 National Spring Leadership Conference

Then, on Saturday, March 4th, SAR member Mel Stewart Hankla, Ed.D., kindly displayed a few of his famous artifacts, like the Isaac Shelby's rum swig and powderhorn and an original Kentucky rifle by the gunsmith Michael Humble. These were on display at the head table of the NSSAR Executive Officers in a beautiful glass display case for all to enjoy. Compatriot Hankla's brief presentation on the artistry of Kentucky's Historic Icons that *in*spired his book <u>Into the Bluegrass</u> was a real treat that I will remember for a lifetime.

133rd VASSAR Annual Conference and Crossing of Dan

The Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolutions 133rd Annual meeting commenced on February 9th and ended on the 11th, and was held at the lovely Berry Hill Resort in South Boston, VA.

On Friday, February 10th at 5:00 p.m. the 242nd Anniversary of the Crossing of the Dan and Commemoration of General Greene's was in full swing starting with the Banister Crossing presentation of the 250th American Revolutionary War Anniversary Program Planning in Virginia and North Carolina inside the Halifax Courthouse in Halifax Co., VA. Directly after the presentations by Cheryl Wilson, Executive Director of VA 250th and Drew Gruber, Executive Director for the Road to Revolution Heritage Trail. Two of Colonel William Grayson chapter compatriots were honored in the Memorial Service for Compatriots of the Virginia Sons of the American Revolution; they were Robert Leroy Krebs and Roy Woodrow Richey.

The following morning, Saturday, February 11th at 10:00 a.m. the Crossing of the Dan commemorations began with opening remarks from President Gary Lee Hall of the Dan River Chapter of the Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, at the beautiful Prizery building in South Boston, VA. Leading the *Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution Color Guard* in opening ceremony was Brooks Lyles, NSSAR Historian General. The weather and temperature were just right for an outdoor Wreath laying Ceremony. The program included the presentations of about 25 to 30 wreaths, and Colonel William Grayson Chapter President, Michael B. Wilson, proudly presented the chapter wreath in honors, on the behalf of the compatriots of Col. Wm. Grayson Chapter.

Following lunch there was an Orations Contest and Youth Awards at 2:00 pm back at the Berry Hill Resort and these students' presentations were by far, the best part of the trip. What a treat to witness the three talented high school teenagers compete for winner of the VASSAR Oration contest. At the General membership meeting, starting at 3:45 p.m., Colonel William Grayson Chapter JROTC-ROTC Scholarship Program and Eagle Scout Scholarship Program candidates were announced as the 2023 first place VASSAR winners. A special congratulations and thanks go to John Callaway, JROTC Committee Chairman and Timothy T. Cline, Eagle Scout Scholarship Committee Chairman for their hard. And thanks to Past President Ross Schwalm leadership in 2022!

In closing, the Colonel William Grayson Chapter was recognized and received nine new streamers for our chapter flag. Streamers awarded to the Col. Wm. For the first quarter of 2023, we have had four new member applications approved. Five more are pending review with the State Registrar or at the National Headquarters. The review process is taking about five months at present.

February 18, 2023: Memorial Marker for Patriot Phillip Richard Fendall – Alexandria, Va.

Members of the Colonel William Grayson Chapter participated in honoring the memory of Patriot Phillip Richard Fendall at the dedication of a memorial marker in the garden of his home, the Lee-Fendall House in Old Town Alexandria. The event was sponsored by the George Washington Chapter.

Patriot Fendall was born in Charles County, Maryland in 1734 and was related to the famed Lee family of Virginia. During the Revolution he served in public service positions including Clerk of Charles County, election to the Convention from Charles County, and serving on the Committee of Observation for Charles County. In 1784, he bought land from Revolutionary hero, and his cousin, Light Horse Harry Lee and constructed his home on Oronoco Street. He was a business partner of George Washington in the creation of the Potomac Canal Company and Washington was a visitor to the house. Due to this close connection, it was decided to dedicate the monument on Washington's Birthday weekend.

VASSAR Second Vice President Michael Weyler officially dedicated the marker. SAR Chapters that presented wreaths included the Virginia Society, George Washington, Col. James Wood II, Sgt. Maj. John Champe, Col William Grayson, George Mason, and Fairfax Resolves. The Virginia DAR District V Director Nancy Hill presented a wreath along with the Anna Maria Fitzhugh and Kate Waller Barrett chapters. The VASSAR Color Guard added dignity to the ceremony by posting colors and standing guard during the ceremony.

The George S. & Stella M. Knight Essay Contest is open to all US Citizen and Legal Resident students attending home schools, public, parochial, or private high schools in the same grade ranges 9-12.

To participate, students must submit an original 800- to 1,200-word essay based on an event, person, philosophy or ideal associated with the American Revolution, Declaration of Independence, or the framing of the United States Constitution. Each student's essay is judged based upon its historical accuracy, clarity, organization, grammar and spelling, and documentation.

The contest is conducted in three phases: the local chapter, state-level society, and national phases. The contest must be entered through an SAR chapter near the student's residence.

Anjali Ghafoerkhan, a Junior at Gar-Field Senior High School, was recognized as the winner of the annual Colonel William Grayson Chapter, Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution Enhanced Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) competition at the 11 March 2023 Chapter meeting. Cadet Ghafoerkhan advanced to the Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (VASSAR) competition taking first place at the state level. She will compete at the National level this May.

March 12, 2023: Vigil at the Tomb of Colonel William Grayson - Woodbridge, Virginia



On March 12, 2023, Colonel William Grayson Chapter (CWGC) conducted an event in remembrance of the 250th Anniversary of the establishment of the Virginia Committee of Correspondence. The committee was approved by a Virginia House of Burgesses resolution on March 12, 1773. The CWGC event was conducted at the Grayson Family Tomb site in Woodbridge, Virginia. The Color Guard was composed of members from several Virginia SAR Chapters and was commanded by CWGC Vice President Andrew Mills.

Prince William County Board of Supervisors member for the Woodbridge District, Supervisor Margaret A. Franklin, offered comments welcoming SAR, DAR, C.A.R. and supporting community and historical organizations to the event. After the Pledge of Allegiance, the Good Shepard Housing Foundation, owners of the property where the tomb is located, was presented with a SAR Flag Retirement Certificate. Foundation Treasurer Darryl Lundgren accepted the certificate and was gifted a new flag pole wrench to aid in keeping the National Colors in proper position per direction from the President of the United States.

CWGC Past President Ross H. Schwalm provided the keynote address on the history of how the Virginia Committee of Correspondence was established and how it related to future events in the drive to United States independence. The Grayson Family became leaders in the Prince William County Committee of Safety and eventually officers in the Continental Army. The address ended reminding all of William Grayson's service as one of the first Senators from Virginia who died in office on March 12, 1790.

Greetings and comments were next provided by Virginia Society President Ernie Coggins. Wreath presentations and honors were led by National Society SAR Chancellor General Michael Elston. Historical Notes:

Grayson's Additional Continental Regiment



On December 27, 1776, Congress notified General George Washington that it had authorized the raising of sixteen additional battalions on an at large basis, and that Washington was authorized to appoint the colonels to command the new regiments. Colonel William Grayson, then an aide to the General, was offered command of one of these additional Continental Regiments. Recruiting began in early 1777 for men to serve a "term of three Years or during the continuance of the War with Great Britain, and upon such pay bounties & allowances as have been resolved on by Congress"
