## June 22, 2023: SAR Heroism Commendation and Medal presented to Virginia State Trooper Justin C. Clack

Compatriot William C. Collier presented the SAR Heroism Commendation to Virginia State Trooper Justin C. Clack at the Virginia State Police Area 45 Office in Arlington. Virginia.

#### His citation reads:

On November 15, 2022, at approximately 1454 hours, Trooper Justin Clack attempted a traffic stop, on a 2020 Dodge Charger, on northbound Interstate 395, at Duke Street for reckless driving charges. The driver of the Dodge Charger failed to yield to Trooper Clack's instructions and accelerated at a high rate of speed. Trooper Clack initiated a traffic pursuit which continued northbound on Interstate 395 until the vehicle crashed with a civilian vehicle at Boundary Drive, just prior to Washington DC. The civilian driver was checked out by fire and rescue but refused transport. All four occupants of the fleeing vehicle were detained at the scene. Trooper Clack recovered three firearms, two Glocks and one "ghost gun" that had no serial number. All were loaded and chambered with ammunition. Trooper Clack also recovered approximately 30 blue pills, suspected to be Fentanyl. There were also three small baggies of a crystal rock substance, suspected to be methamphetamine. Trooper Clack secured 13 warrants related to this pursuit / traffic stop. Trooper Clack's actions are in the highest traditions of the Virginia State Police.

Trooper Clack was recognized by the SAR for the Law Enforcement Commendation in 2021.

# June 22, 2023: SAR Life Saving Commendation and Medal presented to Virginia State Trooper Matthew E. Spalding

Compatriot William C. Collier presented the SAR Life Saving Commendation and Medal to Virginia State Trooper Matthew E. Spalding at the Virginia State Police Area 45 Office in Arlington. Virginia.

#### His citation reads:

On December 15, 2022, Trooper Matthew E. Spalding saved the life of an individual who was unconscious, in a vehicle that was on fire. At approximately 1057 hours, Trooper Spalding responded to a call concerning an accident in the area of southbound Interstate 495 and Route 7. When Trooper Spalding arrived, the front of the vehicle began to catch fire. As Trooper Spalding approached the burning vehicle he noticed the driver, in the driver's seat, appeared unconscious. Trooper Spalding attempted to get the driver's attention verbally and when unsuccessful, he then opened the door and physically removed her from the vehicle. Trooper Spalding then dragged her to a safe location, away from the vehicle as the fire continued to spread towards the driver compartment. Trooper Spalding remained with the operator of the vehicle who was in and out consciousness, until Fire and Rescue personnel took over her care. The operator was transported to the hospital, for further medical evaluation, and while in transport stopped breathing. The operator had to be administered NARCAN, which revived her. The operator received additional medical evaluation and services at the hospital. Trooper Spalding's swift and decisive actions were instrumental in saving a life. Trooper Spalding's attention to detail and quick response reflects greatly upon himself, the Virginia State Police and the entire Law Enforcement Profession.

The story of our Patriots does not stop on the pages of a book, or the etching on marble stone, it continues beyond that, through the diligent efforts of Sons' and Daughters' research and locating of Patriots like the five above, and the eight additional ceremonies held in the great Northern Virginia area this year. Through our continued efforts to locate other unmarked Patriots' graves, we will not only bring the necessary attention during the America's 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of their great gift to us: our Constitution, the Bill of Rights and an independent Supreme Court, but also honor their sacrifice and dedication to a nation of free men.

### **Historical Notes:**

To George Washington from Colonel William Grayson



Dumfries [Va.] April 8th 1777.

Dear Sir.

I wrote you by the two last posts respectively, and hope that my letters have safely got to Head Quarters.

Since the date of my last, Dr. Alexander has applied to me, to know, whether I would purchase his medicines; He has assured me, the principal part of them, have been imported within these two years; the assortment consists in general of useful medicines, & with the assistance of a proper proportion of bark, would answer extremely well for a regiment; I have prevail'd upon him, not to dispose of them, till I hear from you.

With respect to the recruiting service, I wrote you fully in my two last letters, since which there has been no material alteration; the Georgia officers are forbid by Governor Henry's proclamation, to recruit any more; but I am inform'd there are several South Carolina officers inlisting men on our frontiers without any authority from this Government; I beg leave to inclose you a letter from Capt. Granville Smith, a gentleman of unexceptionable character, & who is very anxious to get into the service, by which you will percieve some of the difficulties we labor under of recruiting men in this State.

A report prevailing here, that General Lee, has been tryed by a Court martial & acquitted, & that he is admitted to his parole in New York, the Hessian Field Officers, have importun'd me to write to you on the subject, & to know your pleasure with respect to their inlargement from close confinement; A line from you on this head would (they say) lay them under the greatest obligations. I am with the greatest regard yr Affect. frd & most Obedt Servt
